Updated Government guidance for early years and childcare providers

actions for early years and childcare providers during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak has been updated (22nd September 2020). Includes:

- the use and disposal of face coverings
- supervised toothbrushing programmes (section 3)

- EYFS disapplications ending on 25 September 2020 (section 7)
- emergency first aid (section 7)
- the Job Retention Bonus scheme (section 10)

New exemption to allow for "consistent childcare"

- The Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Matt Hancock, announced a new exemption to local restrictions to allow families to access "consistent childcare". From 22nd Sept 2020 this will cover formal and informal arrangements for childcare - not playdates or parties.
- Residents in Bolton must not meet indoors, or a private garden, with people they do not live with.
- However, the new rule means people looking after children under the age of 14, or vulnerable adults, will be exempt from the ban when it is necessary for caring purposes.
- Children under 14 will be able to be cared for by individuals outside of their immediate household as part of a care bubble
- Arrangements must be part of a consistent childcare relationship

EYFS Disapplications

26 Sept to 25 Nov 2020:

This is the transitional period for the safeguarding and welfare requirements that were disapplied (including PFA) – providers will need to work to re-instate the safeguarding and welfare requirements in full by the 26 November 2020

- The Early Years Foundation Stage statutory framework remains a legal requirement that MUST be adhered to.
- all of the learning and development and assessment disapplications cease to apply as of 25 September – providers will be required to reinstate the EYFS for these areas in full from the 26 September
- Further restrictions or requirements related to COVID-19 due to a local or national lockdown may affect a provider's ability to comply with the EYFS.
- Between 26 September and 31 August 2021, if the government confirms that an area will be subject to COVID-19 related requirements or restrictions and those restrictions prevent an early years provider from meeting the prescribed requirements of the EYFS, the disapplications will be automatically applied. These will begin immediately and will last throughout the period of the restrictions (as governed by the regulations or direction). We allow a 2 week transition period once the restrictions are lifted.

PPE

National guidance states that additional PPE is **only** required in childcare settings and schools in a small number of **exceptional cases**.

Settings are advised to procure PPE via existing procurement routes. If you are struggling to source PPE, a request can be made for an emergency PPE pack by contacting: <u>policyandperformance@bolton.gov.uk</u>.

If incorrectly used, PPE can give a level of false reassurance. Single Point of Access for SEND Referrals

- Referrals for SEND advice and specialist support from Educational Psychology or Ladywood Outreach and Start Well now go through a Single Point of Access
- Often SENCOs refer to several agencies at one time, when this might not be necessary
- If you want to access support you can send your Early Help Assessment to one inbox at <u>EYSENDSPOA@bolton.gov.uk</u> and a panel will meet fortnightly to allocate actions.
- This will save time and be much more efficient in getting the help and support you need.

Promotion of 2 year-old funded places

- Statutory introduction of the Rec Baseline Assessment postponed to Autumn 2021. Schools had the opportunity to sign up to the RBA Early Adopter year.
- Schools who chose to participate will receive assessment materials before the October 2020 half term, with optional assessment window opening for six-weeks after the October half term.
- LA will collect on entry to Reception class data week after ½ term 10th November longer deadline

Early Years Integrated Communication & Language Pathway

- Next Communication Champion Briefing released on the 7th October, discussion group on 15th October

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Government's £1 billion Covid catch-up package

- Schools are being encouraged to sign up for a Reception 'catch up' programme focused on raising outcomes in speaking and language skills among young pupils whose education has been disrupted by Covid-19 at a crucial time for their development.
- Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) and other partners to scale-up delivery of the Nuffield Early Language Intervention (NELI).
