

Age Bracket


The number of people who are unvaccinated, men with one or two doses and women with one or two doses


Bolton new COVID-19 cases timeline, by testing pillar








Case rate per 100,000 people for 7-day period ending on 10 July 2021:






Bolton case rates by ageheatmap





| Notification of cases | From July 19th All notifications will be via NHS Test and Trace system. | Current arrangement will continue. Settings can continue to inform local authority single point of contact (LA SPOC) so early intervention in outbreak management is achievable. |
| Contact Tracing | NHS Test and Trace will contact trace all positive cases. From 16th August No contact under 18 will be required to isolate but will be advised to PCR test. Under 18's will not need to isolate whilst waiting for a test. From 18 years and 4 months contacts with an incomplete immunisation status will still have to isolate. Contacts fully immunised will be advised to take a PCR test but no requirement to isolate. | LA SPOC will still provide advice on who should be classed as contact and who to refer to testing if education setting make contact. |

Key messages to reduce risk of COVID-19 from July 19th

- Prompt identification and isolation of suspected and confirmed cases
- Good ventilation
- Maintaining regular cleaning of frequently touched surfaces
- Promoting good hand hygiene
- Promoting vaccination for eligible staff
- Continue twice weekly LFD testing including summer provision



Local Support: Index Case Reporting and Contact Tracing – Summer 21

Bolton's Single Point Of Contact (SPOC Hub) arrangements will remain in place throughout summer 21 to support an enhanced and complementary offer on top of the NHS National Track and Trace system.

• School settings, summer schools, early years can still report cases to the SPOC Hub (as per current arrangement via the Action cards).

The SPOC Hub will continue to offer:

- support to manage cases in their settings
- support to manage and advise re isolation of cases
- support to identify close contacts
- support with close contacts once identified who will be required to Self Isolate (pre 16/8/21)
- support if close contact once identified will be exempt from Self Isolation (post 16/8/21)

Headlines from Guidance update 19th July

• Out-of-school settings and wraparound childcare providers can offer provision to all children, without restriction on the reasons for which they may attend.

Early years providers

- At Step 4 we will no longer recommend that it is necessary to keep groups apart as much as possible. If your setting is due to close for the summer but will be still open after Step 4, you may continue with these measures until the end of your summer term.
- You should make sure your outbreak management plans cover the possibility that in some local areas it may become necessary to reintroduce keeping groups apart for a temporary period. Any decision to recommend the reintroduction of keeping groups apart would not be taken lightly and would need to take account of the detrimental impact they can have on the delivery of education and childcare.
- Settings will continue to have a role in working with health protection teams in the case of a local outbreak. If there is an outbreak in a setting or if central government offers the area an **enhanced response package**, a director of public health might advise a setting to temporarily reintroduce some control measures.



HR Considerations (correct as at 15.7.2021)

- Travel Advice recent update is that staff travelling from destinations on the Amber list do not need to
 quarantine if they have received double vaccinations. Travel guidance is changing all the time, please take
 advice on individual circumstances from your HR Adviser.
- Staff Workforce staff who are Clinically Extremely Vulnerable (CEV) do not have to shield and can be in the workplace. They may wish to take extra precautions in terms of vaccinations and maintaining social distancing.



30 hours reminder for parents

Parents – please remember that you need to have a valid 30 hours code for the start of the autumn term (**September 2021**) for your child to be able to access their additional funded hours.

If you already have a code and it is due to expire before the start of term, you must reconfirm your eligibility by 31st August at the latest!

If you applied very early for the 30 hours funding and received a code, you will need to reconfirm your details before the start of term (by 31st August 2021).



- If you have contact with any families with children aged 2-4yrs, please signpost to the funded programmes.
- 2yr old applications can now be done online by parents via the Citizens Portal or at their local Start Well Centre.
- 30 hour codes will need to be valid on the 1st September to be used for next term schools offering 30hrs places will need to check validity before the end of term.
