


Let's get back to...
school routine



Current COVID-19 picture in Bolton

- Case rates remain high but level
- Spread is highest amongst younger age groups 15-44s
- Small number of cases translating into serious disease and hospital admission



Context – we are now at Step 4 of the Government's Roadmap

- Restrictions eased across society
- In education and childcare settings ...

Government objective to maximise the number of children and young people in face to face education or childcare and minimise any disruption, in a way that best manages the COVID-19 risk

- Bubbles are no longer advised
- Children who are close contacts wont need to self-isolate
- NHS Test and Trace to undertake contact tracing of positive cases
- The pandemic is not over measures may still be necessary

Step 4:

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Coronavirus remains a serious health risk. You should stay cautious to help protect yourself and others.

- Meet outside, or open windows and doors for indoor visitors
- If you think you have symptoms stay at home and take a PCR test
- Wear face coverings in crowded places and on public transport
- · Check in to venues when you go out
- Wash your hands with soap regularly, and for at least 20 seconds
- Get vaccinated

Baseline measures

- Staff should test themselves using LFD twice at week at home until the end of September when this will be reviewed
- Settings should continue to ensure good hygiene, appropriate cleaning regimes and keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- All settings should continue strong messaging about signs and symptoms
- Children, staff and other adults should follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do. They should not come into the setting if they have symptoms of coronavirus
- Face coverings public transport and dedicated transport to school or college

DfE Contingency framework: education and childcare settings




- The types of measure that settings should prepare for

Local authorities, Directors of Public Health and PHE health protection teams can recommend measures in individual settings



Positive case in a child



- * From 16 August, you will not be required to self-isolate if you live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 and any of the following apply:
- you are fully vaccinated
- you are below the age of 18 years 6 months
- you have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- you are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons Fully vaccinated means that you have been vaccinated with an MHRA approved COVID-19 vaccine in the UK, and at least 14 days have passed since you received the recommended doses of that vaccine.


NHS Test and Trace will contact you to let you know that you have been identified as a contact and check whether you are legally required to selfisolate.

For all cases relating to staff, please also see the guidance for workplaces: NHS Test and Trace in the workplace

Employers should call the Self-Isolation Service Hub on 020 3743 6715 as soon as they are made aware that any of their workers have tested positive.

If cases amongst staff mean a setting meets the threshold, described above, employers will need to provide the 8-digit NHS Test and Trace Account ID (sometimes referred to as a CTAS number) of the person who tested positive, alongside the names of co-workers identified as close contacts. This will ensure that all workplace contacts are registered with NHS Test and Trace and can receive the necessary public health advice, including the support available to help people to self-isolate. When settings should consider further action (thresholds)

Secondaries – only applies after the initial two ATS tests are complete

For most education and childcare settings, whichever of these thresholds is reached first:

- 5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period; or
- 10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period

For special schools, residential settings, and settings that operate with 20 or fewer children, pupils, students and staff at any one time:

 2 children, pupils, students and staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period Close mixing, examples:

- a form group or subject class
- a friendship group mixing at breaktimes
- a sports team
- a group in an after-school activity

General updates - HR

Can we ask which members of staff who has been double vaccinated?

We can ask the question of staff but would need to respect the right of the individual to choose not to disclose.

If staff refuse vaccination and then have to isolate due to being identified as a close contact what is the expectation regarding pay?

Section 10.9 of the Green Book (Local Government Terms and Conditions) states that staff receive normal pay for those who have to self-isolate, so the expectation would be that this would be paid. You can, where practicable request that the member of staff be given work to do at home.

School leaders also need to continue to consider that it is still appropriate to pay those who are self-isolating due to them being in close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case therefore they are potentially infectious. This is to ensure that people continue to isolate when necessary, and in doing so help stop the spread of COVID-19 by not attending the workplace.

Should a member of staff who refuses to be vaccinated be given a different role in school?

There is no reason why a member of staff who refuses to be vaccinated should be given a different role in school.



- Managing coronavirus (COVID-19) in education and childcare settings GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)
- 17 August 2021 Updated <u>contingency framework</u> ahead of the autumn term, in line with wider government guidelines. Includes new thresholds at which you might consider seeking public health advice and taking further action to reinforce measures already in place, updates to the circumstances in which local health protection teams or directors of public health might recommend you introduce some additional measures, and annexed guidance for managing cases in settings from 23 August.

C02 monitors

- All schools to receive carbon dioxide monitors GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)
- The Department for Education (DfE) will be providing all state-funded education settings with carbon dioxide monitors in a bid to identify ventilation requirements.
- Circulating fresh air into indoor spaces is said to be key preventing the spread of Covid-19 indoors.
- The DfE says that "the majority" of the 300,000 monitors will be provided over the autumn term. Special schools and alternative provision will be given priority.
- The monitors are designed to allow staff to act when ventilation is poor and provide reassurance where existing measures are working.

New EYFS Framework in place

With effect from 1st September, all Early Years Providers in England must follow the new Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework.

The key aims of the reforms are to:

- improve child outcomes at age 5, particularly in early language and literacy, especially for disadvantaged children; and
- reduce workload, such as unnecessary paperwork, so that practitioners can spend more time interacting with children in their care.

The key areas of the reforms are:

- revised educational programmes and early learning goals, including a clear focus on early language development;
- changes to the EYFS profile assessment requirements at the end of reception year including removal of the 'exceeding' criteria and statutory local authority moderation; and

a change in the safeguarding and welfare section of the EYFS, promoting children's oral health and other small changes in that section to bring it up to date.




The EYFS framework:


- sets the standards that all early years providers must meet to ensure that children learn and develop well
- ensures children are kept healthy and safe
- ensures that children have the knowledge and skills they need to start school
