3rd Dose

A 3rd dose of a Covid-19 vaccine is being offered to people aged 12 and over who had a weakened immune system when they had their first 2 doses.

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<p>A 3rd dose is for people who had or have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a blood cancer such as leukaemia or lymphoma • a weakened immune system due to a treatment such as steroid medicine, biological therapy, chemotherapy or radiotherapy • an organ or bone marrow transplant • a condition that means you have a very high risk of getting infections 	<p>All 3rd doses should be as soon as 8 weeks after the 2nd</p>	<p>Options include: If you're eligible, your GP or specialist should contact you regarding your 3rd dose. You may also get a letter from the NHS.</p> <p>Some walk-in sites in Bolton are now offering the 3rd dose but an NHS letter will be required.</p> <p>Check NHS Bolton CCG social channels or visit: www.boltonccg.nhs.uk/patient-zone/coronavirus for up-to-date details of walk-in sites.</p>	<p>All adults who have recently had coronavirus, should wait four weeks (28 days) after the date they received a positive test to get any dose of the vaccine (1st, 2nd, 3rd or booster).</p> <p>Anyone needing help in accessing a 2nd, 3rd or booster dose can also contact NHS Bolton CCG on: 01204 462125, 462157, 462028.</p> <p>Phone lines are open Monday to Friday, 8.30am to 5.30pm. Boosters

The booster helps reduce the risk of being admitted to hospital this winter. Like some other vaccines, the level of protection can reduce over time so a booster will give you better protection and for longer.

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<p>Eligible people include those:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> aged 40+ people who live and work in care homes frontline health and social care workers aged 16+ with a health condition that puts them at high risk of getting seriously ill aged 16+ who are a main carer for someone at high risk from Covid-19 aged 16+ who live with someone who is more likely to get infections such as someone who has HIV, has had a transplant or is having certain treatments for cancer, lupus or rheumatoid arthritis <p>People who are pregnant and in 1 of the above eligible groups can also get a booster dose.</p> <p>All boosters are Pfizer or Moderna unless advised otherwise for medical reasons.</p>	<p>Booster dose must be at least six months after 2nd dose</p>	<p>Options include: Book an appointment online at www.nhs.uk or call 119.</p> <p>Wait to be invited to a local NHS service, such as your GP practice.</p> <p>Some walk-in sites in Bolton are now offering the booster dose.
